#### **DDC 2024 Annual Report**

Our 2024 annual report has been approved by the DDC Board and is available on our web site on the home page at <a href="www.downtownpeoria.us">www.downtownpeoria.us</a>. We are excited to see so much growth and activity in downtown Peoria. With a total of 448 rental units and 180 privately-owned condos already occupied downtown, there are an additional 500-700 new units planned at five different buildings in the downtown! Recently, 100 residential units opened at Adams & Oak, and Peoria 812 Lofts on SW Washington Street will open 126 units within the next few months. Also on our radar: The Chic Building on Adams Street, Adams Street Center, 800-801 SW Washington Street, and the PNC Building on SW Adams Street.

We are proud to play an integral role. We welcome your feedback and thoughts on the future of downtown Peoria.

### **Distillery Labs - Ribbon Cutting Ceremony**



On July 30th, DDC staff and board members attended the ribbon cutting ceremony for Distillery Labs, located in the Central Business District at 201 SW Adams Street. The facility offers entrepreneurs a space to develop their startup, brainstorm ideas, and learn new skills. Distillery Labs is part of the Illinois Innovation Network promoting entrepreneurship throughout the state. A \$10 million grant helped fund construction at the former site of Illinois Central College's downtown campus. The site boasts a full commercial kitchen and a coffee bar, a spinoff of Café Santa Rosa in Peoria Heights, which is open to the public. The new façade is eye popping and adds an ultra-modern look to the Central Business District.

## Adams & Oak/Pop-Up Chicken Ribbon Cutting Ceremony



Last month, we were pleased to host a ribbon cutting ceremony at Adams & Oak, located at 800 SW Adams Street. A large crowd attended the event as Mayor Rita Ali and local dignitaries launched the newest project in the Warehouse District. "This project is more than just a renovation; it is a symbol of our commitment to sustainable development and smart growth," said Mayor Ali.

Co-owner, Roxanne Ibe, was proud to announce the opening of the 90 residential units as well as the opening of Pop-up Chicken Shop and Love Shack restaurant, managed by Aaron Francis. Both Roxanne and Aaron were on hand to thank the community for their support and to welcome patrons. #### Press Release: Adams & Oak

In 2020, Baldovin Development Company announced the "Adams & Oak" development, to be located in the former Federal Building and Mitchell Fabrics Building at 800 SW Adams St. in Peoria. On July 24, 2024, a ribbon cutting ceremony was held to announce the official opening of the residential units and a new restaurant, Pop-up Chicken Shop/Love Shack, joining existing commercial tenants Edward Jones and Architectural Design Group.



Adams & Oak stands proudly as the gateway to Peoria's trendy Warehouse District. Just minutes away from I-74, this vibrant, mixed-use, historical renovation project offers over 90 residential apartment units, over 10,000 square feet of commercial tenant spaces, and the largest indoor parking offerings in the area.

The development's one-bedroom, two-bedroom, and studio apartment designs, experienced-based commercial entertainment and retail, and pedestrian-oriented feel directly reflect the culture, style, and desires of the demographic in the area. The apartment units showcase modern features such as quartz countertops, historic concrete floors, eat-in kitchen bars, spacious open-concept living spaces, high ceilings, and more. The units' large windows will showcase the best views in the area.

Residential units are now leasing and going fast! There are just two commercial spaces remaining -- one is approx. 1400 sf and the other around 2200 sf. Each commercial tenant space boasts large storefront windows, high ceilings, as well as exposed concrete pillars, masonry, and other unique architectural details. Each space has street frontage and a pedestrian entry directly from either Adams Street or Oak Street.

Pop-up Chicken Shop/Love Shack, originally opened in Bloomington, IL in 2018, is the newest tenant in the Adams & Oak development at 800 SW Adams Street, having opened in June of this year. Their menu boasts "Illinois" hot chicken offerings as well as "tendos," "snak" wraps, "sandos," salads and more with special sauces and heat levels. They are proud to be located in the Warehouse District.

The Downtown Development Corporation of Peoria (DDC) facilitated the purchase of the building, and we are excited to see just four years later how Baldovin Development Company has developed the space and attracted businesses to locate in the Warehouse District. Residential spurs commercial development. We look forward to so much more to come as Baldovin Development Company leads the way for even more expansion in the downtown in the near future.






### **Outdoor Dining Pilot Program**

**Dining al fresco in downtown Peoria?** The city of Peoria recently launched a pilot program for outdoor dining in the downtown central business district and riverfront with the installation of commercial parklets at Kickback on Fulton and ARDOR breads and provisions.

The program will allow selected local dining establishments to serve customers in sidewalk cafes and make our downtown and riverfront area a more vibrant and welcoming place to be.



## **New mural coming to Downtown Peoria**

Peoria's Planning and Zoning Commission approved a plan for a 32-foot-tall and 35-foot-wide mural to be placed on the city-owned Niagra Parking Deck on Adams Street. The mural, which will be lit at night and visible from the Murray Baker Bridge, features the faces of six people from the Peoria area and the word "Peoria" drawn into the picture. It will be called "Live Greater." The community group Choose Greater Peoria and the Gilmore Foundation will be funding the mural. ## Redevelopment Highlight: GAR Hall



"I am honored to have assisted in facilitating a historic change of hands that just occurred," says DDC Chair Zach Oyler. The 1909 Grand Army of the Republic/Joseph Greenhut Memorial, i.e., GAR Hall, located at 416 Hamilton Blvd., cared for with dedication, blood, sweat, and tears by the Central Illinois Landmarks Foundation "CILF" for many decades, has been sold to Kert Huber for further restoration and care. CILF runs the local historic landmark designation in the Peoria area. Many years of their time and fundraising efforts have been focused on raising money for and taking care of the hall. Now they will be able to shift gears to focus on other landmarking, preservation and social efforts.

Kert Huber has been a longtime historic building owner, preservationist, and developer in Downtown Peoria with projects like 401 Water, Central Bank, Marquette Building, and manager of River Station. He has plans in place to repair the roof, plaster work, heating and cooling system, to name a few. The building will remain a venue focused on veterans and history. We applaud Mr. Huber for taking on this historic landmark!

#### **Powell Press Building**



ICYMI: The City of Peoria is seeking proposals for the lease of the Powell Press Building at 110 NE Water Street.

Built in 1852, the Powell Press Building is Peoria's oldest commercial building. It was relocated to its current location on the Peoria Riverfront in 1997 and underwent a complete renovation in 2010. The facility is located right on the Peoria riverfront.
