
DDC Activities

Historical Spotlight



G.A.R. Hall

At the corner of Madison and Hamilton Blvd. sits one of Peoria's last vestiges of history - the historic Grand Army of the Republic Greenhut Memorial Hall known as the G.A.R Hall. The Hall has graced downtown Peoria since 1909 where it was a meeting place for over 100 surviving Civil War Veterans. Joseph Greenhut, who headed the Whiskey Trust and was a Captain in the Army, donated \$14,000 of the \$22,800 for construction of the Hall. An enterprising fellow, he came to Peoria in 1978 with \$50 in his pocket. He left twenty years later with ten million.

The brick two-story Beaux-Arts style building has Corinthian columns placed on stone and brick. The front entrance has decorative sculptured stone floral urns, wreath ropes and eagles with talons holding cannons. Outside, surrounding the Hall entrance, is a 7,000 pound muzzle-loading mortar. Inside at the top of the stairs is a life-size marble bust of General John A. Logan, sculptured by Peoria's Frederick Triebel. In the auditorium looking down from above are many patriots including President Abraham Lincoln, General George Sherman, and a Civil War Nurse, Lizzie Aiken. Visible from out front is a huge stained glass window with a representation of the G.A.R. fraternal badge. This window completes the symbolization of the patriotism of Union Veterans, their courage, love of country, liberty, and fraternity.

Central Illinois Landmarks Foundation (CILF) has been the custodian and owner of the Hall since 1972. The building is the signature "face" in the Greater Peoria Community of CILF's efforts on behalf of historic preservation.

The G.A.R. Hall is available to rent. Please contact garhallrentals@gmail.com to make arrangements for your wedding reception, birthday party, business meeting, or whatever. Please limit your attendance to about 150. We guarantee a historical event!

As their name implies, they are all about historic preservation in Central Illinois. Accomplishments include the Architectural Archives, saving the LeTourneau Steel House, promoting

healthy neighborhoods with Historical Home Markers, community events, lectures on local history, recognition for area leaders and more.

Maybe you have visited the Greenhut Memorial G.A.R. Hall in downtown Peoria. Since CILF was founded 50 years ago, they have championed this precious resource and fought for its survival. They have formally protected this spectacular Beaux-Arts building with National Register of Historic Places stature, but today they are struggling to keep it safe from the ravages of time. Years and the elements have taken a toll on the Hall. It needs tuck pointing, new heating and cooling units, roof work, a new entrance

door; and their ability to fund these basic necessities has been hammered by the pandemic, which almost entirely eliminated what had been a thriving rental business.

Members are working diligently with elected leaders and governments, foundations, businesses and like-minded organizations to find the resources to take the Hall out of danger. Other options for outdoor dining are Jack's on Adams, Sugar, Thyme, and Kelleher's, all in the Warehouse District. You may even find a few food carts around the courthouse. Historical Tours



Sculpture Walk 2024




Also on May 18th, Sculpture Walk Peoria opens! The Opening Day Event will be held on at the Peoria Art Guild from 9-noon. You can join this free event to meet the artists, create art activities, Face Painting by Colin Abernathy, Balloon art by Steve Curtis and enjoy live music with Sarah Marie Dillard. Intuition Coffee and Juice and Tadoughs Donuts will be available for purchase.

The outdoor public art exhibit will feature 8 new sculptures installed along both sides of Washington Street from the Peoria Riverfront Museum to the Bob Michel Bridge. Shannon Cox, Executive Director of the Peoria Art Guild shares, "The Peoria Art Guild is

excited to be planning the 2024- 2026 Washington St. exhibition. We have sculptures from around the United States and one from Ukraine being placed for our community to enjoy for free for the next two years. We believe that public art is a source of happiness, hope, and inspiration, and we hope you enjoy it."

After the sculptures have been set, the Guild will provide online video tours and free docent tours starting at the Peoria Art Guild every Saturday morning at 10:30 a.m. Memorial Day through Labor Day. Local artist John Heintzman leads the tours. "Artists featured in this year's Sculpture Walk seek inspiration from arts, emotions, culture and society," says John of the pieces featured in this year's exhibit.
