At our October board meeting, Jack Berres, owner of Jack's on Adams, joined us to discuss the climate in downtown Peoria. He voiced concern about the reduced foot traffic in the downtown since the COVID shutdown, citing the slow return to downtown offices of major employers such as OSF Healthcare and Caterpillar. This issue along with others is having a negative impact on downtown businesses. Mr. Berres wanted the DDC to be aware of the issues he and other business owners are facing and asked for our support.

PNC Building




At the September 24th city council meeting, the council approved the purchase by the City of the PNC Building from Cullinan Properties. City staff expects to work closely with the DDC on finding the right developer for the three properties which includes the bank building at 301 SW Adams Street, the Creve Coeur building behind it on SW Jefferson Street, and the attached parking deck. This will be a mixed-use development and an important linchpin property tying the Warehouse District and the Central Business District together. The City knows that it is imperative to get the parking deck repaired and ready for the upcoming Civic Center busy season and will begin assessing the deck structure. The DDC will work closely with the City to assist with the redevelopment of these key properties.

The Carriage House: Office Space

401 NE Jefferson Ave.



The Carriage House is part of the Judge Jacob Gale complex, a separate building with 3,400 square feet of history. This charming property is located right off of I-74 with free parking in a private lot. This historic property can be divided into two suites, one on the first floor and one on the second floor. The former home of the Employer's Association, Timken Bearing sales office, and most recently the Greater Peoria Economic Development Council. Share the great lawn and picnic area with State Representative Eric Sorensen's Peoria Office, the Peoria Area Chamber of Commerce, and the Downtown Development Corporation of Peoria.

The quaint building next door was the former residence of Peoria's 4th mayor, Jacob Gale. The Gale House is simple in design, rich in history and truly a piece of Peoria's heritage. Its 3,200 square feet of office space is also available for lease. The property includes a nice kitchenette and large conference room.


Huge Successes! As we move into late Fall, we say goodbye to many activities that make our downtown so special:


Riverfront Events happen all summer long. We hope you took advantage of the many special events that included many music "fests", fireworks, agility courses, and fun of all types.
