




Livability Magazine Release

Parking in the Warehouse District!




The "new" Depot Street is being poured, and the forms are in for the concrete to be poured for the 300 parking spaces that will service the private developments happening on Washington Street.

Watching these warehouses be converted to residential living and retail is incredible. Great things are happening in Peoria, especially the Warehouse District. From negotiating the land on behalf of

the city to working on the redevelopment agreements for buildings on SW Washington Street, the work is finally coming together. It has been a longtime vision of the DDC to provide adequate parking to serve residents, tenants, and visitors. Parking in the right spot is critical to support commercial and residential properties. We thank the City of Peoria for addressing this need and hope to see even more parking as the Warehouse District continues to grow.

Two-way Street Restoration



Peoria's multi-year project to convert two major downtown streets back to two-way traffic is close to finishing its first construction season.

Public Works Department spokesman Nick McMillion said the first-year work included upgrading 24 intersection corners along Adams Street. **"Right now, we have 22** of those 24 corners completed," McMillion said. **"The remaining corners that we're** going to be wrapping up in the coming weeks, if not next week, will be the northeast corner of Harrison Street and then the northwest corner on Main Street."

McMillion said the reconstruction converted the corners with bump-outs to shorten pedestrian crossing distances as a measure of safety, adding the focus next year shifts to doing the same work at the 20 corners on Jefferson Street in the project corridor.
